Africa Day in Amsterdam

On the 18th of November the Foundation Max van der Stoel organized the annual AfricaDag at Pakhuis de Zwijger in Amsterdam. The NICC Foundation has been present with an Info-stand.

On this infostand, we got the opportunity to discuss the work of the NICC with people interested in Africa and Climate Justice, this year's theme. Throughout the day, workshops were organized on this theme, with special attention for sustainable and equal partnership between Africa and Europe, African voices on adaptation and mitigation, and African practices that Europe could learn from. Because of the strong speakers presenting this topic, ranging from Dutch politicians to African activists, there was a lot of inspiration to be taken away for the future of international cooperation. Former minister Jan Pronk, for instance, suggested that because of the history of international cooperation, international cooperation of the future should be seen as reparation payments from the global North to the global South. This, of course, was the topic for a lot of heavy debates during the rest of the day. What became clear, however, is that to emphasize the importance of remembering the history of international cooperation, the NICC can be of huge value.
