Op 3 oktober 1949 investeerde Nederland voor het eerst anderhalf miljoen gulden in een wereldwijd programma van de Verenigde Naties: het Programma voor Internationale Technische Hulp. De impuls hiervoor komt vanuit Amerika: de Amerikaanse president Harry Truman roept op tot investeren. Later in de jaren '50 zou een belangrijke reden hiervoor zijn het afwenden van de communistische invloed in het Zuiden maar in eerste instantie om de positie van post-koloniaal Nederland globaal te versterken en om Nederlandse expertise (bijvoorbeeld in landbouw en water) in te zetten.

Visit our timeline on Global Citizenship

In the 1960s interest in, and 'solidarity' with 'the Third World' was growing in the Netherlands. In previous decades, civilians engaging foreign activity in (de)colonised countries were often members of missionary groups. In the 1960s, a much broader interest in volunteering emerged to 'help' the peoples of former colonised countries. This movement of concern with citizens abroad can be described as the early roots of ideas and actions in the framework of global citizenship. While today the concept of volunteering is sometimes criticised as (neo)colonial, then it was a relatively new concept, with state organs, churches, civil society organisations and even the royal family involved among others.
