#### **But First: Explore History Webinar**

On November 18th NICC held a webinar to present the research that six researchers have done with the NOT-fund, a collaborative research grant between the National Archive and NICC. Useful insights were offered from the attendees regarding the practical side of these issues, sharing real life experience. Topics such as institutional memory were discussed. The input was much appreciated by the researchers. An important takeaway from this event is that we can inspire through archives and history. A new generation of researchers is still very interested in the area of development cooperation and can offer new insights and angles into existing debates. #### Gender Glossary

During the webinar on the Call to Explore History, Robin Hids offered compelling insights into the evolving terminology in international development. Attendees highlighted how language often reflects a worldview bias, with the Global South historically having limited influence on shaping policy. Inspired by these types of research and guided by a commitment to more inclusive and less colonially centered gender terminology, we are reviewing the gender glossary, adjusting or adding terms and descriptions as needed. At the same time, we aim to acknowledge how certain terms have been used at different points in history, honoring their historical contexts while striving for inclusivity and awareness of linguistic evolution over time.
